Credifton Players see England win at Wembley

Players from Credifton Youth FC's Under 16s team travelled to London on 27th March to take in a tour of the Emirates Stadium and the England Euro qualifying match against Lithuania. The 15 players, some of whom have been with the club for 6 years, left Credifton early Friday morning to travel to London. The first port of call was the Emirates Stadium, home of Arsenal Football Club, where they took a tour of the newest football stadium in the country.

The Credifton boys were able to see first-hand the 'behind the scenes' areas of the stadium from pitchside to the state-of-the-art home changing room and treatment rooms to the luxury of the Directors' lounges and TV studios. Then, after a visit to the Arsenal museum and, having had their photos taken with the FA cup, they moved onto Wembley Stadium for the last England home qualifying game of the season.



The picture above shows three of the oldest serving members of the team Will Baldson, Connor Champ and James Crocker who with Alex Hill (not in photo) have been in the team for over 5 years each.



Having arrived in plenty of time at Wembley, they took their seats amongst the sell-out crowd of 90,000 fans for the evening kick-off against Lithuania for what turned out to be a comfortable 4-0 win for England. The home team fielded a young side and immediately put the visitors under pressure. The first goal fell to captain, Wayne Rooney, and the second to Danny Welbeck. Raheem Sterling then made it 3 with his first goal for England but the spotlight was taken by the young striker Harry Kane who made it 4-0 with less than 2 minutes to go after replacing Rooney on his debut game. After the game, the party headed back to the coach and the long journey home with a bag full of memories of what was for many their first international game.

Credifton Youth FC were pleased to be able to donate tickets for the trip to 4 guests - Joseph Crocker, brother of Samuel, and his cousin, Aaron, who were presented with signed photographs by the Arsenal staff. Also travelling was Credifton Youth Committee member, Dan Marino, and his son, Luca, who plays for Credifton under 13s. Dan, who has been affected by cancer, said he had a fantastic day although a little tiring in his condition. Club Chairman, Martin Daniel, said "Dan is fighting back to full health and is keen to get more involved with the Club and is an inspiration to us all".

Under 16s' Manager, Mike Edworthy, said "the trip was a really good experience for the lads and we would like to thank Adam Hayman of Play The Arsenal Way for help purchasing and discounting the Emirates' tour tickets and Devon FA, who organised the Wembley tickets and finally, to Mild Devon Coaches and their diverse who made the day run so smoothly. But the biggest thank you goes to the lads of the Credifton Under 16s who had a great time and were a credit to the Club".


